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
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HOOME COMING: A JOURNEY THROUGH TIME



On 5th December 2025, thirty years after graduation, the ISC Batch of 1995 returned to Timpany. The hallways, once echoing with the bustle of school days, now hummed with wonder as alumni walked through, peering into classrooms—a journey back into their own youth.

The event was graced by the presence of our Director-cum-Principal, Mrs Vandana Abraham, and our esteemed Vice Principal, Mrs Georgina Veronica, as well as teachers and students from classes 5-12.




PRAYER MEET

TWO-DAY WORKSHOP ON GEOSPATIAL SMART THINKING IN SCHOOL EDUCATION

A two-day workshop on Geospatial Smart Thinking in School Education was conducted on 5th and 6th December at Andhra University by the Department of Geo-Engineering, with technical support from the ISRC – Visakhapatnam Chapter, in collaboration with ISRO. The programme was specially designed for school teachers and students to highlight the growing importance of geospatial technologies in school education.

Day 1 :

Teachers from the Department of Physics, Timpany School and Timpany Senior Secondary School attended the workshop conducted for school teachers. The sessions focused on Geospatial Smart Thinking in School Education, emphasising the role of Spatial Information Technologies in modern-day applications.

The workshop highlighted how tools such as Google Earth, GPS, and satellite imagery have become integral to daily life. Popular digital platforms, such as Ola, Uber, Swiggy, Zomato, Flipkart, and Amazon, were cited to illustrate the extensive use of geospatial technologies in their backend systems. The sessions also stressed the importance of understanding these technologies to address common challenges faced by users. The programme included insightful discussions and demonstrations related to GIS, satellite images, space exploration, and geospatial applications, making the sessions informative and enriching for the participating teachers.



Day 2 :

On the second day, students from Timpany School and Timpany Senior Secondary School participated in an exhibition organised by the Department of Geo-Engineering in collaboration with ISRO. The exhibition featured engaging and hands-on activities, including "Create Your Own Map," space exploration, and puzzle-based learning on tectonics and maps.

Students explored various models explaining satellites, tectonic movements, relief features, and natural disasters. Interactive sessions enabled students to gain valuable insights into space science, satellite technology, and geospatial applications.

Overall, the workshop and exhibition were highly educational, interactive, and inspiring. Both teachers and students expressed that the programme was knowledge-rich and instrumental in enhancing their understanding of geospatial technologies and their applications in everyday life.

The ninth edition of Pariksha Pe Charcha is currently underway, with registration open from December 1, 2025, to January 11, 2026, on the official MyGov portal.

- Eligible participants: students (Classes 6–12), teachers, and parents from India and abroad.
- Registration includes completing an online MCQ-based activity; participants can also submit questions for PM Modi to answer during the event.
- Selected individuals get the opportunity to interact live with the Prime Minister at the event in January 2026.

What Happens at PPC

Students, teachers, and parents discuss exam stress, preparation techniques, time management, confidence, and mental health.

- The Prime Minister shares tips and motivational advice to help students approach exams with a balanced and positive mindset.
- Past editions have been broadcast and widely viewed across digital platforms, with interactive segments and expert insights.

Why It Matters

- Pariksha Pe Charcha aims to shift the narrative around examinations—from stress and fear to confidence, resilience, and joy in learning.
- It fosters a supportive dialogue between the government and students, acknowledging their challenges and reinforcing that exams are part of the growth process, not just a measure of performance.

As of late December 2025, millions have already registered for PPC 2026, demonstrating strong nationwide interest, including students, teachers, and parents of all three Timpany Schools.


Christmas Fervor









Light Up Learning!
